Federal Funding for State and Local Governments

- American Rescue Plan
- FY22 Appropriations
- Surface Transportation & Infrastructure Package



- Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund
 - o \$195.3 billion for States and District of Colombia
 - \$130.2 billion for local governments
 - \$65.1 billion for parishes
 - \$65.1 billion for cities
 - \$45.57 billion cities over 50,000 in population
 - \$19.53 billion municipalities under 50,000 in population



- Parishes and cities above 50,000 in population will receive direct funding from Treasury.
- Municipalities with a population under 50,000 will receive their allocation from the state.
- Eligible sub-recipients



- Timeline for parishes and municipalities with a population over 50,000 to receive and spend funds
 - Expected to receive the first 50% no later than 60 days after enactment
 - Expected to receive the second 50% not earlier than 12 months after the first tranche
 - o Must be expended by December 31, 2024



- Timeline for municipalities with a population under 50,000 to receive and spend funds
 - Funding is distributed through the state governments
 - O States have 30 days to distribute the funds but can ask for an extension up to 120 days



- Eligible uses of funding
 - Respond to the public health emergency
 - o Provide premium pay to essential workers
 - Replace lost revenue
 - O Make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure



- Other state funding
 - o \$10 billion to carry out critical capital projects
 - Related to enabling work, education, and health monitoring, including remote options
 - Each state will receive a minimum of \$100 million.
 - Funding for these capital projects is available until expended



FY22 Appropriations

- Community project funding
 - O House and Senate Democrats moving forward with Member requests
 - House and Senate Republicans have not announced whether they will participate



FY22 Appropriations

- Community project funding
 - o Each Member can request up to 10 projects
 - Expectation that a Member will receive 3 or 4 total projects
 - o Must have demonstrated community support
